

ECHO AUTISM WASHINGTON



ECHO Autism Washington is a training project to increase access to evidence-based diagnosis and appropriate interventions and support services for children and youth across Washington State impacted by autism and other intellectual developmental disabilities and their families.

The virtual live Zoom ECHO training sessions connect Health Care Authority certified Autism Center of Excellence (COE) medical clinicians- MD/DO/ARNP/ND/PA-C - and Clinical Psychologists- with clinical experts and other community partners to learn from each other. It provides clinicians access to case-based learning and didactics, focusing on screening, diagnosing, and continuing care for patients with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and support for the patient’s family.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Assess patients at risk for ASD
- Diagnose patients with ASD
- Refer patients for further evaluation and treatment when appropriate.
