ECHO Autism Washington is a training project designed to disseminate evidence-based practices regarding diagnoses and treatments to increase access to medical services for people across Washington State impacted by autism and other intellectual developmental disabilities. The training connects primary care providers identified through the existing Health Care Authority (HCA) Centers of Excellence (COE) system with experts and other community partners statewide. It provides these primary care clinicians access to case-based learning and didactics, focusing on screening, diagnosing, and continuing care for patients with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) and support for the patient’s family.

- Refer patients for further evaluation and treatment when appropriate
